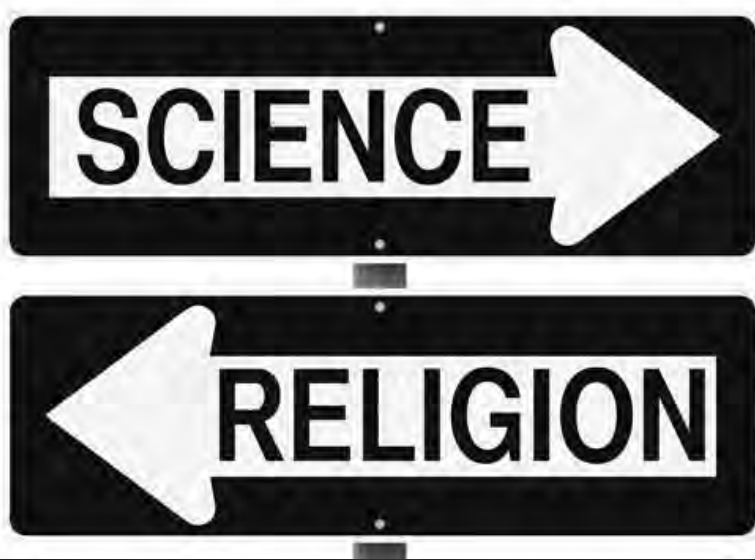

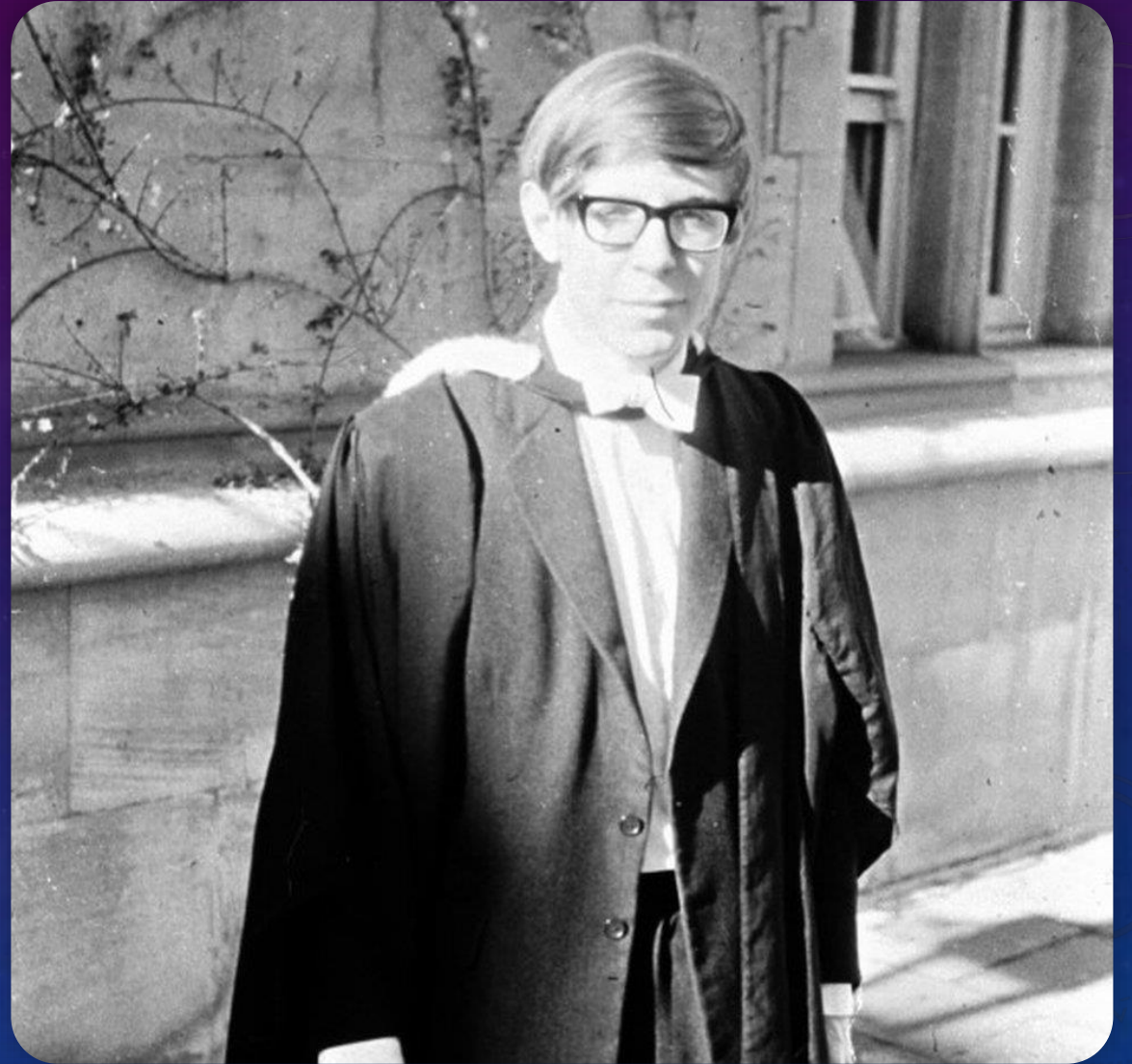




WHERE DOES THIS COME FROM?

- Misunderstanding of science
- Anti-Catholic Stance
 - Gender, Abortion, Stem Cell, etc.
- Assumption that all things are objectively explainable
- Christian Fundamentalism:
 - Miracles – God of the Gaps
 - Creation
 - Characters in the Old Testament – Giants
 - Dragons of Revelation
 - Discrediting objective truths in favor of literal Biblical translation

THERE IS AN ORDER OF THE SCIENCES

- Based on subject matter and procedures
- Hierarchy of what is being studied

ALL SCIENTIFIC ENDEAVORS OPERATE ON AN ASSUMPTION...

- That the physical world is intelligible and the intelligible structure can be apprehended and known
 - That there are causes and effects

ARISTOTLE'S 4 CAUSES

- Material – what it is made of
- Formal – defining characteristics
- Final – purpose
- Efficient – what brought it about

JPII Letter to the Vatican Observatory

Yet the unity that we seek, as we have already stressed, is not identity. The Church does not propose that science should become religion or religion science...Each of these members should become not less itself but more itself in a dynamic interchange...We are asked to become one. We are not asked to become each other.

...The unprecedented opportunity we have today is for a common interactive relationship in which each discipline retains its integrity and yet is radically open to the discoveries and insights of the other.

COOPERATIVE RELATIONSHIP



- Theology is not to incorporate indifferently each new philosophical or scientific theory.
 - Aristotelian natural philosophy → Christ as both God and man.

“I say that if there were a true demonstration that the Sun is at the center of the world and the Earth in the third heaven, and that the Sun does not circle the Earth but the Earth circles the Sun, then one would have to proceed with great care in explaining the Scriptures that appear contrary, and say that we do not understand them rather than say that what is demonstrated is false. But I will not believe that there is such a demonstration, until it is shown to me.”

EVOLUTION AND CREATION

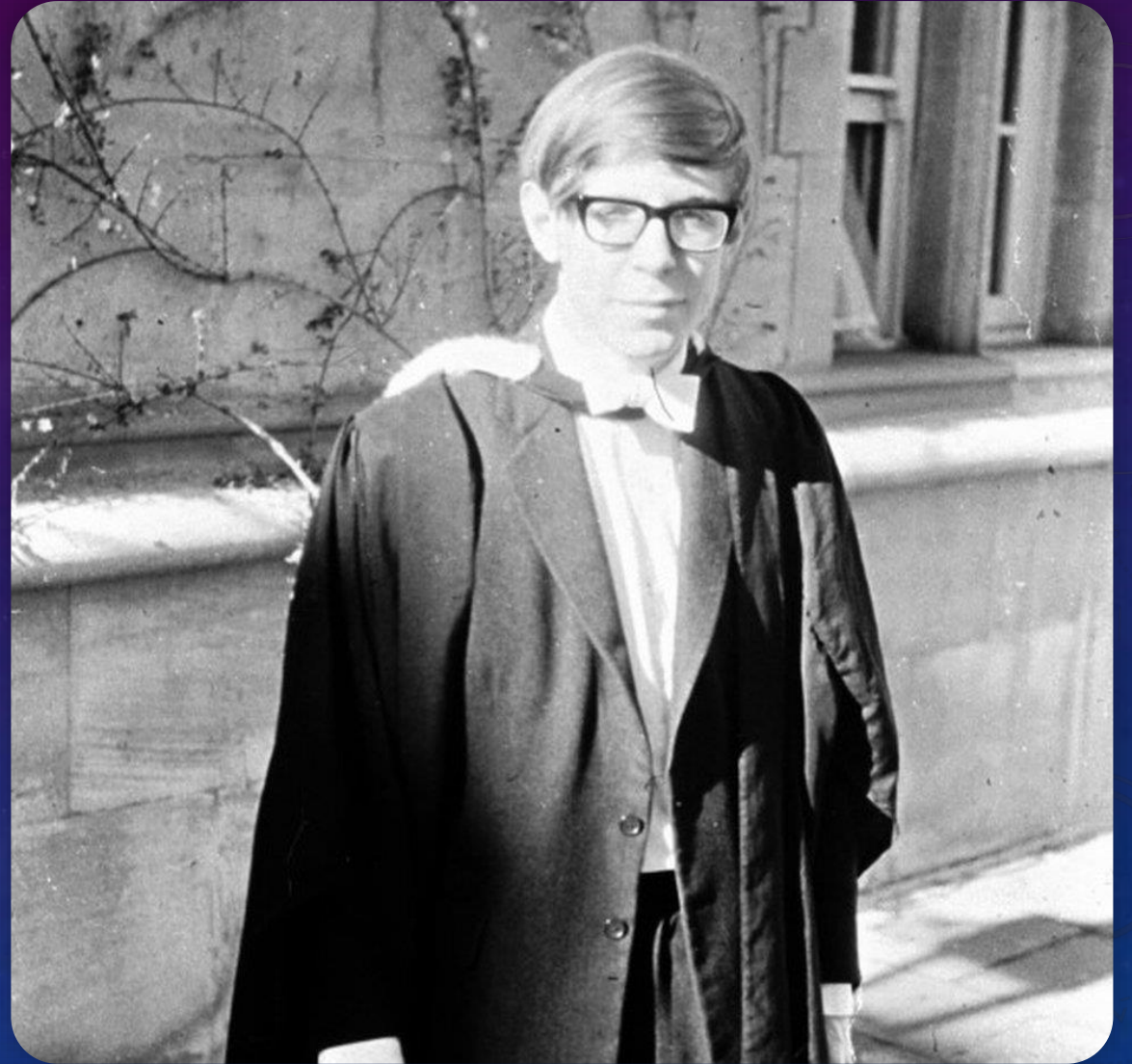
“The Teaching Authority of the Church does not forbid that, in conformity with the present state of human sciences and sacred theology, research and discussions, on the part of men experienced in both fields, take place with regard to the doctrine of evolution, in as far as it inquires into the origin of the human body as coming from pre-existent and living matter — for the Catholic faith obliges us to hold that **souls are immediately created by God**. However, this must be done in such a way that the reasons for both opinions, that is, those favorable and those unfavorable to evolution, be **weighed and judged with the necessary seriousness, moderation and measure**, and provided that all are prepared to submit to the judgment of the Church.” – Humani Generis 36

GLOBAL WARMING

 - Greed and Politics
- The only question is whether they will do this critically...
 - How long have we been able to accurately record temperatures? (1880)
 - Does CO2 cause temperatures to rise or vice versa?
 - Temperatures are showing an increasing correlation with Solar Activity and CO2 follows.
 - Sea levels remained relatively constant throughout the 20th Century.
 - Polar Ice Sheets have not reduced in the last 35 years.
- Do we have better alternatives?
